

# Your guide to applying Pr **ARAZLO**™

how to use ARAZLO

ARAZLO is used on the skin to treat acne in people 10 years of age and older. It is recommended that for children aged 10 and 11 years old, ARAZLO should be used on the face only.

**ARAZLO should be applied in a thin layer once a day to the entire area where you have acne, not just on individual pimples. Follow these steps when using ARAZLO on the face:**

**STEP  
01**

Wash your skin with a mild cleanser  
and pat it dry with a clean towel



**STEP  
02**

Squeeze a small amount of ARAZLO  
(about the size of a pea) on your fingertip



**STEP  
03**

Dot it onto your chin, cheeks, nose, and forehead  
**Avoid the eyes, mouth, the creases around your nose  
and the inside of your mouth or nose**



**STEP  
04**

Gently rub over the entire face,  
then wash your hands



**STEP  
05**

If needed, apply a moisturizer before  
or after using ARAZLO



**Don't overdo it!** Do not use more than you need to cover the treated areas.  
Using too much ARAZLO may increase the risk of skin irritation.

If you develop skin irritation, your doctor may tell you to use a moisturizer, decrease the number of times you apply ARAZLO, or completely stop treatment with ARAZLO.



# Quick tips when using ARAZLO



ARAZLO can increase your chances of having sunburns. Use sunscreen with a minimum SPF of 30 and wear clothes that can protect you from the sun, including sunlamps. Do not apply ARAZLO on sunburnt skin.



Tell your doctor if you are pregnant, if you think you might be pregnant, or if you plan to become pregnant. ARAZLO may harm your unborn baby.



If you are breastfeeding, do not apply ARAZLO to your nipple or to the part around your nipple.



Avoid skin products or cosmetics that can dry out your skin.



If you need to use other medicines on your skin such as benzoyl peroxide during your treatment with ARAZLO, apply one in the morning and the other in the evening.



Do not use ARAZLO on your scalp, armpits, or areas where two parts of your skin touch.



Be mindful that wind or cold weather may be more irritating to your skin during treatment with ARAZLO.



Remember to use ARAZLO exactly as your doctor tells you.
